THE QUEST FOR LIGHT

It is an eternal search dating from the beginning of Time down to the present era. Generation after generations since the dawn of history have engaged in this neverending quest, search or hunt in seeking for the light of understanding, the light of knowledge and the light of compassion.

The great principles upon which our Fraternity is founded are clearly and forcibly impressed upon the viewer by means of symbolic illustration and scenic effects, as the narrator says: A Mason puts his tools to use symbolically to shape his own life, his attitude towards his fellowman, and his belief in God." The film concludes with an inspirational statement by our Sovereign Grand Commander III George A. Newbury, 33^o, looking to the day when the Brotherhood of Man under the Fatherhood of God will become an established fact.

IT COULDN'T BE DONE

One of the most dramatic and inspiring phases of American history has been the creation of projects which, at the time, were considered impossible to accomplish. This film documents great American achievements such as the building of the Panama Canal, the construction of Hoover Dam, the creation of Mount Rushmore, and the building of the Golden Gate Bridge.

OLAF TAMMARK

You are invited to hear a special program on Saturday, March 11, by Mr. Olaf Tammark, a former Estonian National and now an U.S. citizen. He will speak on his eight years experience in Estonia and Siberian Slave Labor Camps as a guest of the Russians. He will describe what happens to a nation which falls to a Communist aggressor. What happens to its government and what happens to its people. As he personally saw and experienced it in his own beloved Estonia. Mr. Tammark became a Forest Brother (guerrilla fighter) after the Russians took over when the War was over. He was fed by peasants who would have been shot if it became known they gave food to an Estonian patriot. When captured, instead of being shot, Mr. Tammark was given a thorough "brainwashing" by experts who gave him an "as homeless."

OLAF TAMMARK cont'd

From Estonia, he was shipped into Russian Siberia where he spent the next six years working in a number of concentration camps in Kazakhstan (the hunger desert). Here he met prisoners from all the nations overrun by Russia. He saw them live and die. Some sickened and died easily. Others were incredibly tough and survived under conditions impossible to describe.

In addition to his lecture, Mr. Tammark will show a series of slides and exhibit some of the articles he made and used while in Siberia.
